Jody Bjerke visits Minnesota Congressional Delegation.

Minnesota hospital leaders, auxilians and Minnesota Hospital Association (MHA) staff advocated for Minnesota hospitals and health systems the first week in May in Washington D.C., during the American Hospital Association's Annual Meeting.

Jody Bjerke, JMHS Volunteer Coordinator, and the current President of Health Care Auxiliary and Volunteers of Minnesota (HCAM) was among the elite group. She was able to share successes and concerns unique to rural communities.

The group told positive stories of how Minnesota hospitals and health systems are transforming care in their communities; stressed the need for predictability and relief from regulations; and urged the delegation to help protect vulnerable populations by providing stable and predictable reimbursement.

Minnesota hospitals also urged our delegation to reject further cuts to hospital outpatient departments; graduate medical education funding; changes to the 340B program; and reductions to critical access hospitals (CAHs).

The group also encouraged the delegation to protect access to care with some specific changes in regulation, including removing the 96-hour physician certification requirement as a condition of payment for CAHs; adopting a default standard of "general supervision" for outpatient therapeutic services; and establishing equity in the Hospital Readmissions Program.

Jody Bjerke said "It is important to meet our delegates in person and make the connection that rural areas like ours matter."

JMHS is pleased to announce the addition of infectious disease (ID) specialist, Dr. Lucio Minces, to our Outreach Providers. An ID specialist is a doctor of internal medicine who is qualified as an expert in the diagnosis and treatment of infectious diseases. ID specialists have expertise in infections of the sinuses, heart, brain, lungs, urinary tract, bowel, bones

and pelvic organs. Their extensive training focuses on all kinds of infections, including those caused by bacteria, viruses, fungi and parasites.

Along with their specialized knowledge comes a particular insight into the use of antibiotics and their potential adverse effects. ID specialists also have additional training in immunology (how the body fights infection), epidemiology (how infections spread) and infection control.

Dr. Minces provides care for patients through outreach as well as acting as an inpatient consultant for hospitalized patients. He is also a member of the infection control and antibiotic stewardship committees.

New Bus Arrives!

When Arlys Armundson rode as a volunteer in the bus with residents she noticed it was loud and bumpy making it difficult to hold a conversation. She was determined to see the Care Center get a new and better mode of transportation.

She spoke with her fellow auxiliarians, and they agreed a new bus should be a priority. The auxiliary would generously donate \$40,000 towards the purchase.

Feeling strongly that a new bus should happen by Spring, they approached the JM Foundation for additional support. After hearing the situation the Foundation agreed to help. The JM Foundation would pay for the bus upfront and also for any costs occurred over the initial pledge. The Auxiliary would pay them back \$10,000 a year for four years.



Purchasing a new bus versus a used one allowed the Activity staff to design the interior to better fit the needs of the residents. The bus can be

easily configured accommodate two

wheelchairs and 12 passengers or three wheelchairs and 11 passengers.

Gail Ochsendorf, Activities Director, said "We are so excited to use this new comfortable mode of transportation. The new bus allows us to increase resident outings and provide new destinations. This is a great way to keep our residents connected to the community!"

Since the bus's arrival, residents have enjoyed outings to Clara City, Wal-Mart, the Lac qui Parle Lake area and the casino! Watch for and wave to the residents enjoying the new bus around the community.
